ACADEMIC ADVISING: Academic Advising at Quincy College promotes the institution's mission of encouraging academic achievement and excellence by guiding your decisions as you identify your academic goals. Advisors will assist you in taking ownership of your educational opportunities, becoming a member of the Quincy College academic community, and realizing your academic and professional potential. In Quincy, the Office of Academic Advising is located on the second floor of Presidents Place—you may schedule an appointment with one of the advisors by calling 617-984-1670 or you can send an email to advising@quincycollege.edu. The office is open from 8:00 am to 6:15 pm every Monday through Thursday and from 9:00 am to 4:00 pm on Fridays. For the Plymouth Campus please call 508-747-0400.

CAREER SERVICES: The Career Services Office at Quincy College provides a comprehensive approach to career planning by offering a wide array of services, resources, and programs addressing career-related issues. These services include career exploration for students who need help with their major or career goals, career counseling, resume writing, interviewing techniques, internships and job placement along with a variety of workshops and seminars. INTERNATIONAL STUDENT SERVICES: The International Student Services Office provides support and services to all international students at Quincy College. We strive to make the transition to college in the United States easy and enjoyable. We encourage you to stop by the International Student Services Office in Room 325 in President's Place. Office hours are Monday-Thursday from 9:00 am-6:00 pm and Friday from 9:00 am to 4:00 pm.

LEARNING & TUTORING CENTER: Our tutoring centers are worthwhile destinations. The Nicastro Learning Center in Quincy and the Learning Center in Plymouth provide free tutoring services. We have one-on-one tutoring and small-group tutoring in most subject areas as well as tutoring for improving academic skills. Both peer and professional tutors work with students during drop-in hours and appointments. Tutoring services are available during day and evening hours. LIBRARY: We have great Libraries in Presidents Place and in Plymouth and much of our collection is available online from your home 24 hours a day, seven days a week. Our Librarians can show you how to use technology to access information online from any location. Copies of required textbook for all current courses are available at each library. I would suggest that you see all that is offered at the Anselmo Library on the Quincy campus. It is open from 7:30 am to 8:00 pm Monday through Thursday; 8:30 am to 5:00 pm on Fridays; and 8:30 am to 1:00 pm on Saturdays. In addition, we have a new and greatly expanded Library at our Plymouth Campus which is open from 9:00 am to 6:30 pm on Monday through Thursday and 8:00 am to 4:00 pm on Friday. Current IDs are required for use of the Library or to check out any materials, including reserve books.

STUDENT SUCCESS COACHING: If you feel stressed out trying to balance your life as a student with all of the other demands of your time, visit the Student Success Coaching Office where the coaches provide free, short-term, solution focused coaching on issues related to transitioning to college; developing academic, personal and professional goals; developing self-discipline and self-motivation; promoting self-care and healthy life choices; reducing stress; overcoming anxiety; and avoiding procrastination. MILITARY AND VETERAN SERVICES: Quincy College takes pride in our ability to provide personalized assistance to all active duty military, veterans and their dependents. The Military & Veteran Services Specialists provide academic advising, VA disability claims information, GI Bill application assistance relative to basic allowance for housing (BAH) and book stipend information, as well as certifying enrollment, tuition, fees, and college credits for processing to the Department of Veterans Affairs. Active duty military veterans and their dependents are able to use their federal education benefits including Post 9/11 GI Bill, Vocational Rehabilitation and Employment, Montgomery GI Bill, Tuition Assistance, MyCAA, and VA Work Study. According to the office of the Jury Commissioner of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, "Every U.S. citizen 18 years of age or older who is a Massachusetts resident and an inhabitant for more than 50% of the time is eligible to serve as a juror. If you are a resident of another state but a student in Massachusetts you are an inhabitant for more than 50% of the year, and, therefore, eligible to serve as a Juror in Massachusetts." Students who miss class in order to fulfill their jury service requirement should notify each of their instructors of the summons and arrange to complete missed work. Also, students could contact the Dean's office if they need assistance in making arrangements for missed class time.

Our academic supports: The Quincy College Libraries, the Learning Centers, Academic Advising, Career Planning, Student Success Coaching, Disability Services and Veterans Services can guide you to become a more successful and dedicated student.
