

Maximum Harm is a compelling examination of the Tsarnaev brothers' movements in the days leading up to the Boston Marathon bombing on April 15, 2013, the subsequent investigation, and the manhunt in which the authorities finally captured Dzhokhar, hiding in a Watertown backyard. McPhee untangles the many threads of circumstance, coincidence, collusion, motive, and opportunity that resulted in the deadliest attack on the city of Boston to date.

Michele McPhee is a bestselling true crime author; three-time Emmy-nominated television investigative producer working with the ABC News Brian Ross Investigative Unit; award-winning magazine writer; newspaper reporter and columnist. She has written five true crime books: *A Professor's Rage*; *A Date With Death*; *Heartless - The True Story of Neil Entwistle and the Brutal Murder of His Wife and Baby*, *When Evil Rules*, and *A Mob Story*.

She has covered high-profile crime cases across the country and has been a commentator on breaking news for national programs on ABC World News Tonight, NBC Dateline, CNN; MSNBC; and the Fox News Network.

Quincy College's "Meet the Author Night" has brought notable authors to Quincy each Fall and Spring and have included such talent as Rick Beyer, author of *The Greatest Stories Never Told* series, Don Hussey, author of *Ticket to Ride*, Stephen Puleo, author of *Due to Enemy Action*, and Casey Sherman, Author of *Boston Strong*.
