Currently, 36 students have gone through the leadership rotation at Hancock Park.

As sixty Quincy College students enter their last semester of the Associate Degree in Nursing, Quincy College has partnered with BaneCare to complement their curriculum, offering a leadership clinical experience, training students to assume leadership roles in the workforce as part of their formal Quincy College education. Currently, 36 students have gone through the leadership rotation at Hancock Park with several students completing leadership clinical at [BaneCare's Bay Path Rehab and Nursing](#) Center in Duxbury.

"Quincy College is proactively addressing the changing educational needs of Nursing students. As NCLEX testing scores decline across Massachusetts and nationally and students face difficulty in passing their nursing certification boards, Quincy College sought to create a curriculum that leads to successful careers. Our partnership with Bane Care allows Quincy College to deliver a leadership clinical to complement our core curriculum, preparing Quincy College nursing students to enter the workforce as leaders," Quincy College Dean of Nursing, Lori Koehler.

Koehler elaborates: "Simply put, we can outline clear objectives, leadership values, accountability across a concept based curriculum but thinking like a nurse in the moment when a doctor is asking for your insight or a patient needs your help is a hard skill to teach in the classroom. This new partnership and leadership clinical experience addresses how to think like a nurse and the needs of 21st century nurses."

In addition to their clinical rotations, Quincy College students participate in four weeks of acute care clinical rotation at local area hospitals, rehab facilities, and elder care services like Braintree Alliance, South Shore Hospital, and Cape Cod Hospital. In addition to the acute care training, Quincy College Nursing students also experience four weeks of hands-on training in a simulation lab at the Quincy or Plymouth campuses.

Students participating in the leadership clinical at Hancock Park in Quincy are learning critical nursing skills that are quite difficult to teach in a classroom such as prioritization, communication, delegation, coordinating care, advocating for patients and families, and understanding the role of the nurse that reflects integrity, responsibility, and ethical practices. They learn these skills during the leadership clinical experience.

"Leadership and management are an important comprehensive part of nursing education. As the student begins their journey through nursing school, they learn to deconstruct the clinical context of the situation at hand. Students at the end of nursing school need to learn to how to apply their knowledge to real situations. This leadership rotation at Bane Care provides Quincy College Nursing students with the opportunity to apply their learning situationally, rather than being solely theory driven," Cynthia Hernan, MSN RN, Assistant Dean of Academic and Clinical Experience for Quincy College Nursing.

The relationship with BaneCare was a natural fit for Quincy College's 21st Century Nursing program objectives. A long-standing, community resource known for excellent care, BaneCare strives to achieve the highest possible quality of care for their patients and residents with several care facilities located across the South Shore.

"Our partnership with Quincy College, their instructors, and students has been mutually beneficial over the years," says Melanie Brance, RN, Director of Nursing Services at Hancock Park. "Students have learned from Hancock Park employees and we have learned a tremendous amount from the students. Hancock Park has also had the opportunity to hire many of students upon graduation; their comfort with our facility has given students a good start in their careers. A Quincy College graduate is now our Assistant Director of Nursing and has a vital leadership role in our facility."

Quincy College hopes to build upon the success found with the BaneCare - Hancock Park partnership and roll out a leadership clinical experience to all of their nursing programs, across different clinical site ensuring that all students graduate with a leadership foundation that informs their careers.
