### **Quincy, MA (5/16/2019):**

On May 15, 2019, Quincy College recognized over 200 students for their achievements during the 2018-2019 academic year and has awarded \$43,000 in student scholarships for the 2019-2020 Academic Year at the college's annual award event, Convivium.

Quincy College President Michael G. Bellotti and Provost and Senior Vice President for Academic Affairs, Gerald Koocher welcomed a crowd of over 500 of Quincy College students, staff, faculty, and friends and family at the Quincy College ceremony.

The event included a presentation of scholarships, awards, and the naming of Magna Cum Laude and Summa Cum Laude academic honors. Summa Cum Laude academic honors are awarded to graduating students with a 3.75 or 4.0 cumulative GPA. Magna Cum Laude academic honors are awarded to graduating students with a 3.50 to 3.75 cumulative GPA. 96 students received Magna Cum Laude honors and 83 students received Summa Cum Laude honors.

Quincy College President Michael G. Bellotti spoke at the event about student success at Quincy College: " This evening shines a positive light on what Quincy College truly stands for, the mission of guiding and supporting our students as they navigate their education so they may realize their academic and professional goals.
