



**Admission Articulation Agreement Between  
Quincy College  
AND  
Community College of Rhode Island (CCRI)**

This admission agreement (“Agreement”) dated February 27, 2024 is between Quincy College, an educational corporation formed under the laws of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts with its principal office located at 1250 Hancock Street, Quincy, MA 02169 (hereafter referred to as “QC”), and Community College of Rhode Island, a community college organized under the laws of the state of Rhode Island with its principal office at the Knight Campus 400 East Ave. Warwick, RI 02886-1807| (hereafter referred to as “Community College of Rhode Island”).

It is agreed by and between QC and CCRI, for the mutual consideration and covenants herein contained, as follows:

1. QC and CCRI hereby agree to an admissions arrangement as set forth in this Agreement, whereby eligible students from CCRI are guaranteed admissions into the Bachelor of Science in Business Management at QC. This arrangement is referred to as the Partner Community College Transfer Pathway to the QC Bachelor of Science in Business Management (“Transfer Pathway”).
2. The terms and conditions of the Transfer Pathway are set forth in detail in Appendix A of this Agreement, (“Transfer Pathway Terms”). The Transfer Pathway Terms, as updated and amended are incorporated in this Agreement by reference. All courses must be completed in accordance with each institution’s academic standards and requirements, as published in the respective current catalog of each institution and set forth in any other applicable materials published by each institution, including the Transfer Pathway Terms.
3. To be eligible for the Transfer Pathway, students must successfully complete an Associate degree program at CCRI with at least a 2.0 GPA in one of the following programs: AS in Business Administration Management (EXHIBIT A), AS in Business Administration General (EXHIBIT B), AS in Business Administration Marketing (EXHIBIT C), AS in Business Administration Accounting (EXHIBIT D), and AS in Business Administration Financial Services (EXHIBIT E).
4. QC will accept at least 62 and up to 90 credits from graduates of these programs. A ‘C’ or better is required to transfer any of the 69 credits of program requirements, and a ‘D’ or better is required to transfer any of the 40 credits of General Education and 12 credits of open electives.

5. Non-credit or remedial courses below college level may not be accepted for transfer. ESL courses are not accepted for credit.
6. QC will also adhere to these additional transfer policies:
  - Accept previous credits earned from Advanced Placement (AP) Exams that have been applied to the completed associate degree at CCRI.
  - Accept previous credits earned from College Level Examination Program (CLEP) that have been applied to the completed associate degree at CCRI.
  - Accept previous credits earned from other exam sources that have been applied to the completed associate degree at CCRI.
  - Accept academic credits earned through the evaluation of military, occupation, training, experience and coursework that have been applied to the completed associate degree at CCRI.
7. QC reserves the right to rescind an offer of acceptance if the student is no longer considered in good academic or disciplinary standing between the time of acceptance and matriculation.
8. CCRI graduates accepted into QC's Bachelor of Science in Business Management are subject to the graduation requirements of the QC catalog and other published standards issued by QC in the year of matriculation. In addition, CCRI graduates are subject to changes that may be required to meet accreditation standards, including, but not limited to, those established by the New England Commission of Higher Education (NECHE) or those determined by QC faculty as warranted to ensure a quality educational program.

QC Academic Affairs will initiate contact with CCRI once a year to discuss curricular changes and make modifications to this Agreement as needed.
9. Both QC and CCRI agree to make information about the Transfer Pathway available to prospective students on their website. Either party may advertise the arrangement described in this Agreement to its students, prospective students, and alumni through print, online, and interactive marketing materials such as fliers, websites, and other advertisements, subject to the guidelines and restrictions further described in this section.
  - a. Each party shall provide the other with a high-resolution logo file and hereby grants the other license to use the name and/or logo for the limited purposes as set forth above.
  - b. Use of the QC name shall be "Quincy College" in all communications about the transfer pathway.
  - c. Use of the CCRI name shall be "Community College of Rhode Island" in all communications about the Transfer Pathway.
10. CCRI will work with QC to promote this Agreement to CCRI students.

11. Neither Institution shall use the name, logo, likeness, trademark, image or other intellectual property of the other for advertising, marketing, endorsement or any other purpose without the specific prior written consent of an authorized representative of the other Institution with respect to each such use.
12. Students with an incoming GPA of 2.5 or above, and with at least 60 credits accepted for transfer into a baccalaureate program, are eligible for a \$100 discount per course, not to exceed a total of \$2,000, for as long as the student continues to pursue the same baccalaureate degree program. QC has final determination on qualifications, award amount, and application of the award.


Information on the scholarship will be made available to prospective students on Quincy College's website. QC will communicate the scholarship changes by June 30 of every year.


13. This agreement is effective on the date signed and will remain in effect until terminated by either party. Either institution may terminate this Agreement at any time, with or without cause, provided that the terminating institution has given the other institution written notice at least 90 days prior to the effective date of such termination and further, both parties agree that no such termination shall adversely affect any student then attending or accepted by QC pursuant to the terms of this Agreement.
14. The parties agree that this Agreement embodies all of the agreements made by and between them, and supersedes any prior agreements and understandings, with regard to the acceptance of CCRI students into QC. Any modifications or amendments to this Agreement must be in writing and executed by both parties in order to be effective.



The Bachelor of Science in Business Management at Quincy College requires the completion of 121 credits including 1) 40 credits of General Education 2) 81 credits of program requirements including 69 credits in business (or related courses) and 12 open electives. A student who graduates from CCRI with an AS in Business Administration Financial Services can transfer to QC a minimum of 62 credits and up to 90 credits. A 'C' or better is required to transfer any of the 69 credits of program requirements, and a 'D' or better is required to transfer any of the 40 credits of General Education and 12 credits of open electives.

\*Note that CCRI requires six credits of math. It is recommended that students who transfer from CCRI to QC take MATH 1240 Statistical Analysis in order to fulfill QC's MAT 107 Statistics program requirement.
