MEETING OF AUGUST 29, 2019

Minutes

The meeting of the Quincy College Board of Governors Presidential Search Committee, held in the Hart Board Room, 7th Floor, Presidents Place, 1250 Hancock Street, Quincy, Massachusetts, was called to order at 5:15 PM. The member roll was called. The following members of the Board of Governors Presidential Search Committee were present at the call of the member roll: Mr. Paul Barbadoro, Ms. MaryJo Brogna; Ms. Eileen Bevivino-Lawton (via phone); Mr. Christopher Carroll; Ms. Craven). Ms. O'Toole was absent at the call of the member roll. A quorum was present.

Also present were Board of Governor Mr. Joseph Shea and Senior Advisor to the President Christopher Bell, Clerk to the Board of Governors and SVP of Enrollment Dr. Jennifer Luddy.

Governor Barbadoro made a motion to accept the minutes from the previous committee meeting held on June 6, 2019. Governor Carroll seconded the motion. On the motion Governors Barbadoro, Bevivino-Lawton, Brogna, Carroll, Craven, voted in the affirmative and the motion was adopted.

Governor Craven opened the meeting by suggesting the committee discuss the upcoming Presidential Search Committee Community forums in Quincy and Braintree in September. At the request of Governor Craven all members engaged in an active discussion on the matter and came up with the following action item list to facilitate the ongoing Presidential Search Process.

Sustainability-What does the vision for a new President have to be in order to ensure stability and sustainability at Quincy College need to be?

What are the main factors and characteristics necessary to be the Quincy College President?
